GENESIS



Hon'ble Chief Minister of West Bengal at the Inauguration of Civil Services Study Centre

The Centre for Excellence in Public Management (CEPM) came into being in August 2009 "to provide technical and wider capacity building support to administrative reforms". CEPM was formed by the Personnel and Administrative Reforms Department (Training Cell), Government of West Bengal under the West Bengal Societies Registration Act, 1961.

In a meeting of the Board of Governors held in December, 2013, a new objective was added by the CEPM, which was to provide good quality coaching at a reasonable fee and help students intending to appear in the Union Public Service Commission (UPSC) conducted Civil Services Examination (CSE).

The objective was also to create awareness about considering civil services as a career option among young men and women of the state. The Government wishes to place special emphasis on the under privileged section of our society - the scheduled caste and tribe, members of the other backward classes including the deprived members of minority communities.

With this end in view, Civil Services Study Centre was inaugurated in January, 2014 by Mamata Banerjee, the Honorable Chief Minister of West Bengal. CSSC functions within the ambit of CEPM.

In May 2021, the dynamic Chief Minister of the state decided to give a boost to the Civil Services Study Centre. She rechristened it, associating the first Indian civil servant Satyendra Nath Tagore, who in 1863 busted the monopoly of the white young men from Britain. CSSC became Satyendra Nath Tagore Civil Services Study Centre -SNTCSSC. The campus in Salt Lake on which it was located till then called Administrative Training Institute, was renamed Netaji Subhas Administrative Training Institute.

As CSSC entered its new phase, rechristened as Satyendranath Tagore Civil Services Study Centre, Shri Surajit Kar Purkayastha, IPS(Retd.) former Director General of Police of the state took over as the Chairman.

Our Mission

Nobody would question that the restructuring of SNTCSSC and infusion of vigour by the Hon'ble Chief Minister of the state was a welcome response to a felt necessity. The necessity stemmed from the unusual dearth of young men and women of this state in the number of bureaucrats, holding all-India and central services. The number was so low that the UPSC and the Department of Personnel and Training of Government of India were forced to choose outside the state candidates to fill in the mandatory home state slots.

The picture of today is a wake-up call because it happens to be a sharp contrast to what it used to be in the past. The prominence of undivided Bengal in the Indian Civil Service continued to flow into the post-independent Indian Administrative Service unabated. As late as in the 70s of the past century, a good number of the annual recruitment by the UPSC were from West Bengal.

It is common knowledge that Departments in New Delhi function based on the vital roles played by senior bureaucrats in shaping and implementing Government policies. We need to ensure that West Bengal is able to have its proper share of the national pie in the administration of the country.

Our mission, therefore, is to create awareness among the bright youth of West Bengal to consider Civil Services as a career option and assist them to prepare for the examination. Our endeavour should reach the youth living in every nook and corner of the state. The elite, middle class, and the lowest stratum of the socio-economic hierarchy, irrespective of their gender, clan, caste and religion, should come within the purview of our umbrella. We have been tardy, therefore we need to work hard and walk faster to reach our goal.

Our Programmes

In order to translate its mission into a reality, SNTCSSC executes quite a few programmes throughout the year. Each programme carries a name based on its nature, purpose and duration.

O Composite Course for Preliminary, Mains and Mock Tests

SNTCSSC has been conducting a Composite Course each year in collaboration with two premier institutes-namely Khan Study Group (KSG) and Shankar IAS Academy (SIA). The course duration is ten months and intensive coaching is provided to cover Prelims syllabus and General Studies portion of Mains syllabus. Mock Tests- both MCQ and Essay type are offered and papers evaluated. Doubt clearing sessions are organised on a regular basis. Classes for quite a few popular Optional subjects with large number of students are taught. Teachers are drawn from the premier universities and colleges of the state and SNTCSSC Faculty. Instructors also include IAS, IPS and other Central service officers currently posted in the city. For subjects considered unusual for UPSC Examination and therefore attracting very few students, a mentorship system is created for the aspirant. Writing practice and doubt clearing sessions are the cardinal features of that system. Essays are taken care of by SNTCSSC's senior faculty.

For admission to the composite course, candidates are selected through an admission test conducted by SNTCSSC.

O Prelims Crash Course

Prelims crash course is designed to benefit a much larger number of aspirants most of whom are not enlisted with SNTCSSC for the Composite Course but have chosen to appear at the on-going year's Prelims Test. The duration of the course varies from 8 to 12 weeks and is held immediately prior to the date of the prelims date of that year set by the UPSC.

Mock Tests are conducted for the students enrolled for the crash course.

O Interview Training and Mock Interview

The Centre provides special training for Interviews and arranges for mock interviews simulating the composition and ambience of the UPSC.

Interview training begins immediately after the Mains examination is over and lasts for about 10 weeks.

Mock Interviews are conducted after the aspirants receive call letters from Dholpur House. Senior bureaucrats and distinguished academicians constitute the Boards, and the interviewees are exposed to four to five such Boards, each with different panelists.

Programme - based Activities

• Interview Training & Mock Interview Sessions for 2022 Batch

Initial preparatory sessions beginning November 23, 2022 were conducted by Prof. Jyotirmoy Pal Chaudhuri followed by Mock Interview Sessions.

O Mains Guidance Programme 2023

Both KSG and SIA extended their full support to provide coaching to about 70 (Seventy) Prelims qualified candidates in their preparation for GS and test series.

SNTCSSC with its own team under the guidance of Prof. Jyotirmoy Pal Chaudhuri organised special sessions starting from 1st July 2023. Classes on a limited number of Optional subjects, answer writing, and essay practicing sessions began on November 7, 2023.

O Interview Training Sessions for 2023 Batch

Initial preparatory sessions have been conducted by Prof. Jyotirmoy Pal Chaudhuri since 7th October 2023. It would be followed by Mock Interview Sessions, simulating the UPSC pattern and ambiance. The Mock Interviews are conducted for only those who have cleared UPSC CSE 2023 Mains.

• Regular SNTCSSC 2024 Batch (Composite Course)

The admission test procedure was revised this year for selection of candidates. Admission Test for SNTCSSC Batch 2024 was conducted on May 7, 2023 (Sunday) from 12 noon to 2pm. The question paper comprised three sections –

Section A: Multiple Choice Questions – 70 marks

Section B: Short answer type questions – 80 marks Section C: Essay – 50 marks

This was followed by a Personality Test which carried 25 marks.

One list of 200 selected candidates and another of 100 waitlisted candidates were prepared based on the final scores of written and personality tests applying the Government Reservation rules.

Results of the Admission Test were published on website (https://www. csscwb.in) on 22.06.2023.

O Inaugural Session of 2024 Batch

The SNTCSSC Batch 2024 was formally inaugurated in a programme held at Confederation of Indian Industries – Suresh Neotia Centre of Excellence for Leadership (CII-SNCEL), Salt Lake on Saturday July 22, 2023.

It was indeed a star-studded occasion with about a dozen of distinguished bureaucrats and academicians adorning the dais.

In his address, Dr. H.K Dwivedi, Chief Secretary to the Government of West Bengal acknowledged SNTCSSC's contributions in training UPSC aspirants from the state. He also commended the institute's efforts to spread awareness about the civil services across the state and assured complete support to it by the government.

Classes commenced on Sunday, July 23, 2023.

O Online Prelims Crash Course and Prelims Mock Test Series for 2024 Batch

SNTCSSC has organised a Prelims Crash Course for the candidates appearing at UPSC CSE 2024.

The inaugural session for the course was held on 7th December 2023. Classes will continue till February 2024. The 12 weeks long course will cover the UPSC Prelims Syllabus and include sets of Prelims Mock tests. The students were enrolled as per first come first served basis. The response has been good. About 500 students have already joined the course.

Our Facilities

The Hostel



Staying in a hostel on the same campus where classes are held and the library also being located within, is an ideal situation which all serious students everywhere cherish to be in. SNTCSSC is aware of it and is striving to create that ambience.

In the meantime, however, with the guidance of the Government of West Bengal and the support of Netaji Subhas Administrative Training Institute, SNTCSSC has succeeded in providing hostel accommodation to a limited number of aspirants.

The Library



The library of Satyendra Nath Tagore Civil Services Study Centre is on the second floor of the same building where the Main library of Netaji Subhas Administrative Training Institute is located. The library room covers an area of approximately 3000 square feet.

It has a hall and 8 cubicles to cater to the exclusive use of advanced students. The hall has quite a number of reading tables with chairs on either sides for readers.

At the moment the library has about one thousand seven hundred books. As expected, the number increases almost every month.

Besides, the library subscribes eight journals - some renowned ones like Economic and Political Weekly, Frontline, Down To Earth and others which are essential for UPSC examination like Competition Success Review, Civil Services Chronicle, Pratiyogita Darpan, Kurukshetra, Yojana etc.

It subscribes four daily newspapers including The Hindus, The Economic Times, The Times of India and Indian Express. It has sixteen wall Maps, An Atlas and a Globe.

Study Materials for UPSC examination preparation published by Shankar IAS, Khan Study Group, Vision IAS, Brain Tree, Vaid ICS, Krushna Bhokare, Evolution, Vajiram & Ravi, and Geographia IAS Institute are available for use of students.

It is open from 8 A.M. to 11 P.M., seven days a week and provides Reading Room Service, Borrowed Book Service, Print Out and Documents Delivery Services.

It plans to have Library Software (Koha), David Decimal Classification (DDC) schedule, for library book classification. Library already provides Wi-Fi service. Shri Sudeb Mondal, an MLIS degree holder is currently in-charge of the Library of SNTCSSC.

District Centres

The idea of extending facilities to further afield was, perhaps, a logical corollary to the awareness programme. There was a need to test the waters and do something concrete to consolidate the gains stemming from it.

This happened on September 2, 2022, when our Hon'ble Chief Minister announced the decision of the state to establish District Civil Services Centres.

At the moment there are 26 centres covering 22 districts. South 24 Parganas, Nadia, Darjeeling and Birbhum have two centres each. All other districts have one each making a total of 1300 young men and women enrolled for taking the UPSC- conducted Civil Services Examination. Classes are offered online to enable working aspirants to be part of the unusually imaginative programme. There are arrangements for offline guidance and doubt-clearing sessions as well. These are conducted by district officials who themselves have successfully appeared at this examination earlier and local University/College faculty. Khan Study Group (KSG), New Delhi is in charge of the online classes. We are proud to state that the programme is bearing fruits and in the first year itself four students - Sayntan Bishnu (North Bengal University), and a girl Snigdha Pradhan (Darjeeling Government College), cleared the Prelims examination held in 2023. This, by all reckoning, is encouraging.

Satyendra Nath Tagore Civil Services Study Centre began its journey in May 2021 and in the third year of its rejuvenated travail now has a total of 300 aspirants attending offline classes on its Salt Lake campus, about 500 students are attending the Prelims Crash Course and 1300 in the districts.

In China, civil servants were taught Confucian ethics. Independent India would legitimately expect the civil servants to 'serve' the nation and the people rather than 'rule'. We would ardently love to see young men and women passing out from SNTCSSC bubbling with Confucian ethics, indomitable vigour of Swami Vivekananda and idealism of Rabindra Nath Tagore to serve the people of our country.
